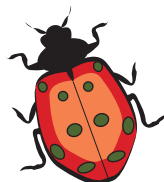

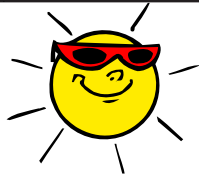

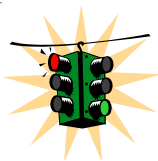
S-101 A Trip Around the World with Music An Experiential Class for Elementary Age Children

You will then receive the blue card which is needed to take the permit test. The fee is \$260. You will be contacted by Pat Foley, Derek Myhre or Jim Spille for your 6 hours of Behind the Wheel. 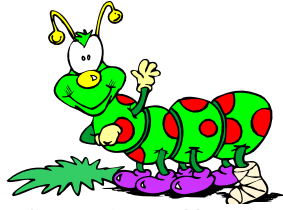

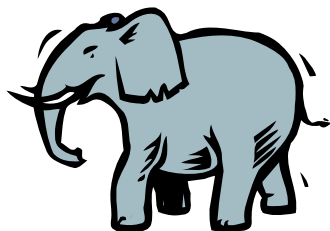
Jelly Beans - Creative Learning

Special African animal section added based on an actual Tanzanian Safari Wendy took last year. We'll spend the week learning about animals and creatures through puppets and creative dramatics. We'll re-create scenes from India where the Tiger hunt Somber, Oceans and the Caribbean Sea where wonderful symbiotic relationships flourish as well as the behavior of Dolphins, Whales and Sea Turtles to name a few. 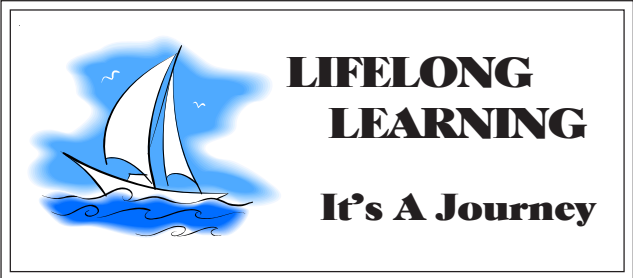

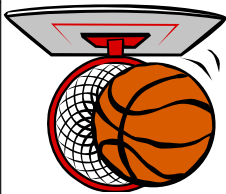

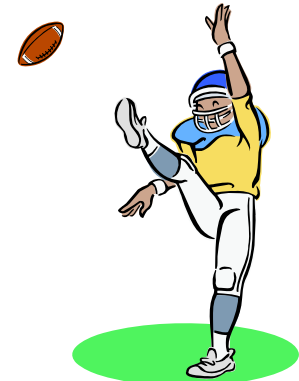
