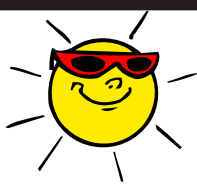

S-102 Engineering: Solar Car Challenge

Combine engineering and alternative energy (solar, fuel cell, hydro & wind). Build cars, cranes, drawbridges from LEGO kits and operate them using alternative energy sources. Students working in teams will start with electricity and use a multimeter to measure continuity, resistance and voltage. Adding concrete experiments with wind, water, fuel cells and solar panels produces a high powered and high energy course. Leave the fossils in the ground and go for the green! Building projects include: waterwheel, windmill, ferris wheel and solar car. Students achieve an understanding of how energy is developed from the sun, wind and water. Students will watch wind or water energy in action by creating a windmill or watermill.
